

- Acknowledging and challenging traditional norms, practices, and structures within education research
 - Why aren't underrepresented students attending university? →
 - What structural factors and barriers are hindering underrepresented students' postsecondary attendance??
- Ultimate goal it to provide an evidence base for policy that will lead to equitable educational outcomes




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RESEARCH WITH LATINX UNDOCUMENTED STUDENTS






- Latinx undocumented students face steep challenges in accessing higher education in the U.S.
- Previous research focusing on undocumented students have examined linear continuation decisions, not considering the myriad pathways students take into and through college and/or university
- We examined the postsecondary pathways of Latina/o/e undocumented students focusing on their initial and subsequent college choice and what state and institutional factors influence pathway decisions.
- We relied on critical race theory and testimonios
- To summarize,
 - Most students in our study attended more than one institution
 - The way institutional actors interpreted policies pertaining to the population shaped their decisionmaking




COMMUTING BARRIERS AFFECTING COLLEGE RETENTION (CORRAL & RAHM, IN PROGRESS)

- While community colleges provide access to higher education, retention rates are a cause for concern
- What is missing from this discussion is how commuting practices shape retention
- We examine the estimated local commuting times and distances by different modes of transportation of students attending a college in Toronto
- Use data from StatsCan and merge on it to distance and commuting data we generated using the *georoute* command in Stata
- Preliminary findings suggest longer commutes are associated with greater chances of student departure
