


"Why don't we want to know what is happening to students in our schools?" No data No problem No solution

Elements of data infrastructure for change/ solutions	<ul> <li>-inked data</li> <li>between K-12 and post-secondary,</li> <li>Between student-level data and programs/resources</li> <li>-ongitudinal – to understand change and causation</li> <li>Demographic information – who isn't getting in? how are opportunities distributed?</li> <li>Comparable across institutions and sectors</li> <li>Fimely</li> <li>Public or routinely available</li> </ul>
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## Timely & Public data matters



In Ontario, the COVID-19 period was marked by an information black hole.

Unlike most major jurisdictions, no data on degree of impact, or where needs greatest.

**US** recovery funds \$1800/student, fall 2020

**Ontario** - \$88/student, Feb 2022
