Students explore a number which students reproduce of (possibly conflicting) stories about a topic

> Students experience and practice rich description (subjective storytelling)

Students must appreciate and demonstrate listening skills

Student work successfully recognizes stories from Indigenous cultures

Students successfully evaluate a story from the perspective of another

Knowledge Assessment: Evolution of Student Learning
